### **Runoff will determine a quarter of the City of Houston's legislative body**

Houston, TX – Harris County Clerk Stan Stanart urges voters to participate in Saturday's, December 10<sup>th</sup>, City of Houston Runoff Election. **“The Runoff Election will determine a quarter of the City of Houston's legislative body. I encourage all qualified registered voters in Houston to vote and let their voice be heard”**, said Stanart who is the chief election official of the county.

By law, a Runoff Election is held to determine a winner from the two candidates who received the largest number of votes in a contest where no candidate received a majority of the votes in a General Election. In this instance, the Runoff Election ballot includes City of Houston Council At-Large Positions 2 and 5 and Single-Member Districts A and B.

To vote in the Runoff Election registered voters must reside in Houston proper. Registered voters with a Houston address who have questions about their eligibility to vote in this election can visit [www.harrisvotes.com](http://www.harrisvotes.com) and use the 'Find Your Election Day Poll and View Voter Specific Ballot' option to determine whether they are qualified to vote in this election. At [www.harrisvotes.com](http://www.harrisvotes.com), voters can also find their Election Day polling location and view the contests that will appear on their individual ballot.

Qualified registered voters who did not participate in the Nov 8<sup>th</sup> Election may vote in the Runoff Election. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
