## Please Verify your Voting Location

### Many Election Day locations have changed for the Primary Runoff

Houston, TX – **“It is very important that all voters look up their voting location before heading to the polls. On Election Day voters must vote at the designated voting location for their precinct,”** asserted Stanart. Voters can look up their voting day location at [www.HarrisVotes.com](http://www.HarrisVotes.com) or call 713.755.6965. Due to historically low voter turnout in Primary Runoff Elections, the Democratic and Republican Parties reduced the number of Election Day polling locations. In this instance, Republicans will have 68 polling locations while Democrats will have 78.

**“The last chance to let your voice be heard in the Republican and Democratic Primary Runoff Elections is Tues., July 31”** said Stan Stanart, Harris County Clerk and Chief Elections Officer. He urges eligible citizens to exercise their right to vote. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at voting locations throughout the county.

Voters participating in the Republican Primary Runoff Election will see at least 7 contests on their ballot, while voters in the Democratic Primary Runoff Election will see at least one. Voters who did not vote in the May 29 Primary are eligible to cast a ballot in one of the Primary Runoff Elections. But, if a voter voted on May 29 and is planning to vote in a Runoff Election, he or she cannot cross over and vote in a different party’s Primary Runoff.

At the end of the early voting period, almost 90,000 voters had participated in this Primary Runoff election. **“Compared to the number of ballots cast in Primary Runoff elections held in this millennium, Harris County is poised to experience its highest voter turnout in a Primary Runoff Election ever,”** informed Stanart.

Over 39,000 ballots by mail were requested from the Harris County Clerk’s Office for these elections, with over 26,000 already returned. Except for Military and Overseas voters, all mail voters must return their mail ballots to the County Clerk’s Office by 7 p.m. on Election Day.
